Dear Antonio Families,

There has been a great buzz around the school this year with plenty of excitement, focus and great learning happening.

I thank you all for your great contributions to this by attending events, supporting your students to be ready for school and supporting our staff.

### New Year 3-6 building update

The Year 3-6 building development is proceeding on track to date with the demolition now complete and the site preparation for the new building being worked on. This week the builders have reinforced the retaining wall in the back south-east corner of the site with further concrete being poured.

We have also had the following work completed in the last few weeks:

### **Guttering Replaced**

You may have noticed we have had guttering on the admin building being installed last week and being finished this week. Once the south-east corner of the building site has been finished, the team will return to finish the last section of guttering that is within the building site.

### **Irrigation Work**

In the coming weeks some sections of our irrigation will be repaired and updated after extensive works on the oval and in some garden beds.

#### Painting

The gym toilets, outdoor steps, OSHC area and the front of the school have been painted recently to keep them fresh, clean and safe for everyone to use.

### Positive Behaviour Interventions and Support (PBIS)

This year our school is embarking on a two year journey engaging with PBIS to review and build the most effective practices and processes for developing positive behaviour and culture for our context. This will be based upon research conducted by the contributors to the program and upon the data we collect in our own community.

This week our PBIS leadership team which includes Sarah Sweeney, Nicole Hayes, Kerry Cornelius Meghan Lander, Megan Friday and myself engaged in the first day of the program designed to set up processes, structures and protocols for this work to commence and progress.

In the coming weeks the team will prepare to work with staff, students, PFC and School Board to inform everyone about the program and start this process.

We will also be using our newsletter, Seesaw, assemblies, website, workshops and other tools to keep you informed of our progress.

### New School Board members 2024

This year we welcome new School Board members Alicia Benz, Julie Field, Lauren Pinos and Naomi Albanos who will join Chris McInerney, Amy Davey, Lauren Lorton and Millie Marra on the School Board. I thank our new members and look forward to them contributing to the strategic discussions and decision making processes in our community.
