Reading Focus in 2023 - Everyone's reading for homework

This year at Antonio we aim to be a reading powerhouse school where we are **all** reading with growing confidence, understanding and skill. We will be achieving this through our teaching and learning programs that explicitly teach reading skills, capture the joy of reading and inspire everyone to read a little each day.

Our homework will simply focus on every student engaging in reading for at least 10 minutes for Reception - Year 2 students and at least 20 minutes for Year 3 - 6 students. This reading time can include students reading independently, reading together with siblings/yourself or being read to.

The infographic on this pages provides a great summary of the benefits of reading on your child's learning and wellbeing. It is never too late to start reading and benefitting from it.

Hoskin Building Redevelopment Update

We are looking forward to the new building development creating 8 classrooms, breakout spaces for technology, science and cooking, small group work rooms, staff preparation rooms and new toilets starting later this year around October.

Prior to this starting, possibly in April, we will have transportable classrooms delivered to the Antonio oval (along the fence adjacent to the gym) for classes currently in the Hoskin building to move into. The Green Doors room will also move to be situated between the music room and the gym. This move will take place in the April term break while everyone is offsite to reduce disruption and keep everyone safe.

I look forward to meeting you all at our upcoming Community Welcome Night on Wednesday 1st March from 5.30pm.

Bringing the Bible to Life at School

Antonio school staff were very fortunate during the staff days before school began to learn with Robyn Mercer, a teacher and expert in using the method of Godly Play to bring to life the message and relevance of stories from the Bible.

Robyn uses a range of materials including simple wooden figures to retell scripture stories in a way that is engaging and relevant. The script used and simple actions involved help to create a reflective and thought-provoking space for children and adults alike.



The day with Robyn was inspiring and while we continue to add to our Godly Play resources, we are eager to help our students make sense of the stories they hear and the invaluable messages they discover for everyday life today.

At the conclusion of the story, the storyteller asks some open-ended questions to encourage the children to reflect on the story help us think about the meaning in our own lives.

"I wonder...are you in the story or which part of the story is about you?" "I wonder...what do you think Jesus trying to teach about children through his words and actions?

Welcome to the new school year. School Fees statements will be posted out in week three. If you do not receive it by 17th February please let me know and I can check the address we have on file and reprint it for you. Many people completed payment option forms at the end of last year but if you require new authority forms or help to calculate the payment amounts please send me an email.

The payment in full date to ensure a 5% discount is set for 28th February which is in week 5 and the first instalment due date is 3rd March if paying each term. There are many payment options being: payment in full; in three or four instalments Terms 1, 2, 3 & 4; by regular payments to the office; or by setting up a Direct Debit or Credit Card Authority. Payments can be made by cash, cheque, credit card, direct debit, Bpay or via the Qkr phone application. (Qkr installation instructions will be attached to this newsletter). You can send noncash payments through your child's classroom communication box or drop off payments direct to myself in the office. Receipts will be sent back to you via your child's communication box for cash, cheque or manual credit card payments.

Enclosed with the fees for new families will be Direct Debit form for those who wish to use this service. I recommend the Direct Debit as an easy way to set up regular payments that can be spread weekly, fortnightly or monthly throughout the year. Please remember I need a few days notice for a Direct Debit to be set up, but once it is set up your details are kept on file and you can amend the amounts each year without the need to fill in a new form, you just need to advise me of the new amount. You can even leave it open ended so that payments will continue into the next year to help keep the regular amounts lower. Keep in mind if you set up a payment straight away there would be 40 weeks, 20 fortnights or 10 months left for these payments. If you wait until later then there will be less payments so they will have to be higher amounts. If you need some help to calculate how much each payment should be please call me or email me at *accounts@antonio.catholic.edu.au* and I will email you back the recommended amount.

Breakfast Home Packages

If your family would like a package of breakfast spreads (jam & vegemite), milk, bread & cereal for home use – you are welcome to contact the Front Office here at school by email or phone, and we will liaise with you regarding pick-up arrangements.



Foodbank Vouchers

We also have available 'Customer Pays Vouchers' from Foodbank who sponsor our Breakfast Club program at Antonio School. With the voucher, clients are able to access the Foodbank Hub four times, no more than once per week. With each individual shop, clients are able to spend up to the amount stipulated on the voucher. A lesser amount is able to be spent. Payment can be made using EFPTOS or Basics Card. Fruit, vegetables and bread are free. Grocery items are vastly cheaper than found in supermarkets. Please contact the school by email or phone if you would like to access this assistance.

Music and Performances

Welcome to a new school year and plenty of music making!

There are some opportunities for students to be involved in extracurricular activities at Antonio, and if your child is interested in any of the following ensembles, they can see me at school.

Choir – open to grades 3-6, with rehearsals during school hours.

Band – open to grades 5-6, with rehearsals during school hours.

Drum corps – open to grade 6 only, with rehearsals during lunch time.

Wakakirri – open to grades 3-6, with rehearsals after school in Term 2 and early Term 3 only. A fee is charged to cover costs. Further information about Wakakirri will be forthcoming later this term.

We also offer instrumental music tuition via Pathways Music School.



There is a prospectus and enrolment form available on request at the front office. Currently, we offer tuition in voice, drums, guitar and piano. Students participate in an evening concert towards the end of the year, and there is the option of either individual or small group lessons, which take place during school hours.

The best gift any parent can give a child is the love of books and the joy and benefits of independent reading for fun. Children who read at home, or are read to, have a head start on reading success in school.

Our class is participating in **Scholastic Book Club** this year. Up to twice a term, during the school year, I will send home a Club catalogue with a different selection of books offered for all ages.

You'll find award-winning books and bestsellers, as well as old and new favourites. I recommend them because the books span a wide range of children's reading levels and interests and because they are inexpensive (some books cost as little as \$2).

It is easy to order. The **Book Club LOOP** platform for parents allows you to pay by credit card. Your child's order is submitted directly to school safe and sound and the books will be delivered to class. You can place your child's order at **scholastic.com.au/LOOP** or using the **LOOP** app, which can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play.

Owning your own books is something special! I hope that you will encourage your child to order books this year. Each order helps earn free books and teaching materials for our classroom, however there is never any obligation to order. I know of no better way to encourage reading than to allow children to choose the books they want to read.
