Dear Parents and Carers,

I was privileged to meet some of you and a number of our student's grandparents at our Welcome Night last week. In our busy lives I am increasingly aware of the importance to create time for the important things in our lives such as time to talk, relax and learn with family, friends and others.

The liturgical season of Lent, which we are in now, is a great time for removing the things in our lives that make us busy but may not be as important, so we can enjoy the important things which help us to be strong, resilient and grow for ourselves and those around us.

For me the important things are sharing a meal with family where we laugh, share stories and learn from each other, listening to some good music, being in the garden helping it to grow and noticing the seasons, working with our great staff to develop exciting new projects and opportunities for them and their students, watching our students discover something new, stretching their thinking and understanding about their world.

I feel privileged to work at Antonio where I experience these later moments regularly.

At Antonio we have four key values which guide our work together. These values are JUSTICE, INTEGRITY, INSPIRE and JOY. This term we are focusing on our value of JOY. What brings us joy? How do we share joy with others? Is joy something to be shared? Do we experience joy when we are grateful?

When talking with students across the age groups I have learned quite a few things about joy, especially in connection with Antonio.

Niki: 'Having friends to play with brings me joy'.

Kobe: 'Laughing with my friends brings me joy'

Alyria: 'Teachers helping me with my work.'

Charlie: 'My family, because they give me cuddles.'

Elena: 'Having excursions like aquatics.'

These comments all focus around our relationships with significant people in our lives. For these children, they experience joy in connection with others. I experience it as I walk through learning spaces both inside and outside when I interact with our beautiful children and listen to their explorations, discoveries, ideas, thoughts and celebrations. I find the most important thing that helps me experience joy is being ready and open to experiencing it. I have to be ready to notice those things that bring me joy and this can be hard when we don't have time. I am focusing on making the time to notice these important things. I hope you can do that too.

Reflecting on the Holy Family ...


Neveyah: The Holy Family is special because they love each other.
