Below is a summary of the feedback received by the end of the day Monday 5th June which included 26 responses:


1. Who attended your learning conversation.

It is great to see so many students attending the learning conversations as we aim to ensure they play an active role in their learning and improvement. When we are all involved in the conversation we can all play an active role. Our second principle at Antonio is...

We are all active teachers and learners

The top three responses in the second question were:


- 1. You have a clear understanding of your child's learning and wellbeing progress
- 2. The teacher had prepared notes/evidence of student progress
- 3. You have clear actions to support your child's continued learning and wellbeing progress

These three points are critical for ongoing learning improvement.

I am interested in finding out more about one of the lowest totals for what contributed to the learning conversation being successful being 'your child contributed.' A few questions I have are:

- Was this low because their child did not contribute? Can they be supported in a different way to contribute?
- Were the contributions from the child not seen as relevant?
- Were there things to be discussed without the child being present?
- 3. Are there any improvements that could help the learning conversations to be more successful? Please select as many as you like and add your own suggestion in other.





4. Which age group is your child/are your children in at school? Please select as many as required.





The option to meet with specialist teachers was the top response to question 3, so we will look at this option closer for future learning conversation schedules. The next highest responses in question 3 were about more time to discuss your child's progress and also having a summary of actions and directions for supporting your child's ongoing learning and wellbeing progress.

We will review this data with staff and the School Board to inform future planning and preparation for our next conversations. We are always working to provide the most informative learning conversations for all families.
