Updated Student Reports

On Monday of the final week of this term you will receive your child's Semester One Summary Report in a labelled envelope addressed to you.

These reports will look different to our previous reports and will be similar to all reports being sent home in all Catholic Schools in SA using a software package called SEQTA.

The report will have four pages that will include the following information:

Page 1 -Front cover with name, class and photo

Page 2 -Explanation of information included in the report

Page 3 -Summary of your child's level of achievement and approach to learning, with a general comment from their home room teacher, record of attendance their progress in developing the skills outlined in the poster above.

In 2024 we will be embarking on using SEQTA Engage which will be a new way for you to receive real time information about your child's levels of achievement and progress in their learning areas. These levels of achievement will be summarised each semester in the summary written reports like the one you will receive in the last week of this term. We anticipate continuing to use Seesaw which provides a strong platform for sharing visual and text information about your child's learning and upcoming events.

Page 3 of the Semester Summary Report will look similar to the following sample. The achievement section below highlights a Reception student achievement level. Years 1-6 students will have a grade in this section.

What does my child learn in Religious Education?

All Catholic schools in South Australia follow the Religious Education Curriculum called Crossways. Crossways includes content on beliefs about God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit, about the Catholic tradition, and its relationship with other religious and philosophical worldviews. It includes learning about social justice and the dignity of all people. The curriculum also includes development of skills in seeking meaning, questioning, and interpreting scripture.

Faith, Maya and Hamo share below some of their classes RE learning at the moment ...

We were thinking about fables and how they have morals. We're writing our own story with a moral, as a comic strip. A fable often has characters who start off being rude, or ignorant and unkind to one another. And then there's a change, they learn a lesson and change their behaviour.

We're reading bible stories and trying to understand them better and what morals they teach.

We're learning about the Three Worlds of the Text to help us understand bible stories.

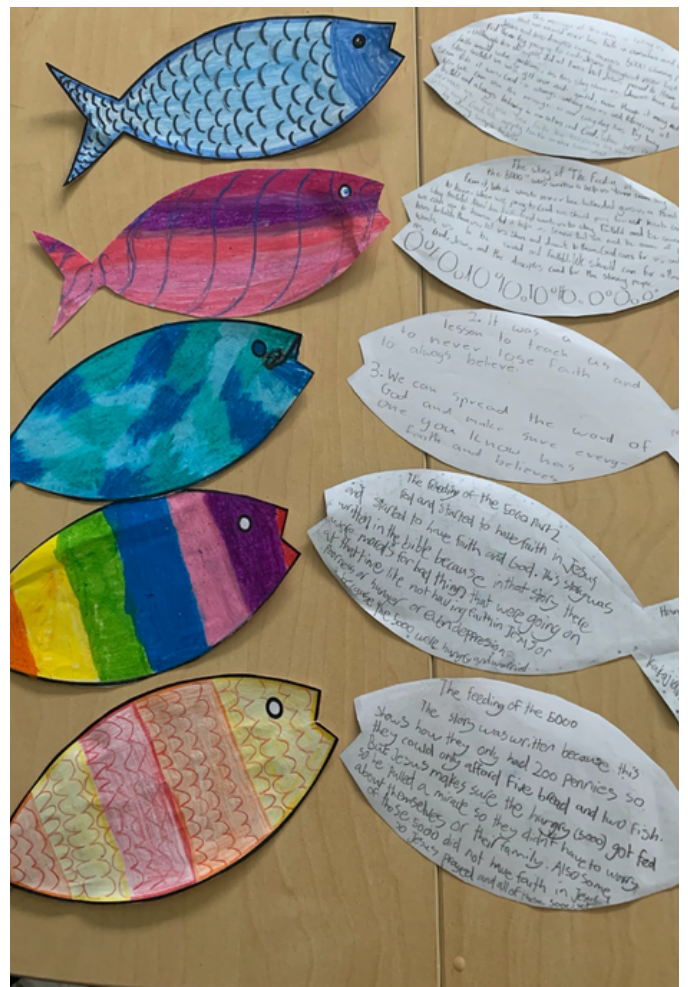
Using Three Worlds of the Text, you ask questions like:

- What was it like for them then?
- Why did they write this story?
- How did they feel about the story?
- What meaning did it have for the people then?
- What is the meaning for us now?
- How can we use it today?

We read two different Gospel versions of the Feeding of the Five Thousand and after learning about it we wrote our own ideas about what it means for us.

Some of our thoughts about this story ...

- never stop believing in yourself – the disciples kept questioning Jesus and didn't think he could do anything about feeding the people.
- it's worth persevering and praying
- never stop having faith in God
- help others when they're down
